 President Wendy conducted a poll of the membership last week regarding how people wanted to be contacted. 30 members replied. Here are the results:






 There will be a Literacy Campaign Kickoff on Sept 4th at the Cascade Theater. This is one of a few social issues our President is very passionate about.

PROGRAM - CALFIRE WOOD PRODUCTS GRANTS

Thursday's presentation was by CalFire's **Justin Britton** of the Wood Products and Bio-Energy Team. They are tasked with maintaining and enhancing the wood products infrastructure of California to support healthy resilient forests along with the people and ecosystems that depend on them.

- CAL FIRE's Wood Products and Bioenergy team seeks to maintain and enhance the forestsector workforce and businesses of California to promote healthy resilient forests throughout the state by supporting a diverse set of business development and workforce development projects.
- Eligible business development projects include facilities, operations, and professional services
 that support the restoration of healthy, resilient forests by offering improvements to the wood
 products industry.
- Eligible workforce development projects include universities, colleges, government and community organizations, and businesses that aim to increase workforce capacity in the fields of logging, fuels treatment, transportation, manufacturing, or other support services that bolster the development of a resilient forest sector workforce.
- Research and development projects related to both business and workforce development will also be considered.

The Wood Products Team intends to maintain a continuously open solicitation for Business and Workforce Development Grants as funding availability allows.


