PROGRAM

A theme for President **Wendy's** year will be literacy, and to further that end today's presentation, given by our own **Shauna Bambino**, was about the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, an effort to improve literacy rates in young children. Below are some highlights.



Why Early Literacy Matters

1 in 3 American children enter kindergarten without the skills they need to learn to read.

57.2% of 3rd graders in **Shasta County** were **not meeting** Literacy Standards as of 24/25.

When a young child enters kindergarten **ready for school**, there is an **82%** chance that the child will **master basic skills** by age 11, compared with a **45%** chance for children who are **not school-ready**.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

- Dolly Parton launched the Imagination Library in 1995 to foster an early love of reading and learning in her hometown of Sevier County, Tenn.
- The Imagination Library has since become the highest quality, most recognizable and most effective book gifting resource in the world.
- Over 280 million free books have been gifted since the program's inception in 1995.
- More than 3 million free books are gifted each month to children around the world.



How Dolly Parton's Imagination Library Works

- Dolly Parton's Imagination Library mails free high-quality, age-appropriate books to registered children every month from birth to age 5.
- Children enrolled from birth receive 60 books by the time they graduate from the Imagination Library program.
- The Foundation covers overhead costs and negotiates wholesale pricing for the books, while local community partners cover the cost of mailing and decided-upon wholesale book prices.
- All children in Shasta County, birth to age 5, can enroll. There are no income restrictions.
