Jack Kimple presented an update on Polio Plus:

Karen Lightfoot was announced as the new district polio chairperson for District 5160. She currently lives in Chico and teaches at Cal State, Chico. Her husband, **Rob**, and **Karen** lived in Palo Cedro for many years prior to moving to Chico.

Bill Gates was quoted regarding Rotary's commitment to polio eradication, emphasizing the importance of continued funding.

There have been 21 polio cases worldwide this year, primarily in the border region between Pakistan and Afghanistan. - Afghanistan is projected to be the next country to become poliofree, with the current number of cases significantly reduced from 350,000 before the vaccine.

Recognition was given to club members participating in polio fundraising and awareness efforts.

- Nominations from the floor are being accepted until the election date.






- Service projects are being planned, with Brad Rullman to send out a list of activities that are financially feasible.

Program Summary by Our District Governor

District Leadership, Membership, and Program Updates

- The district governor oversees approximately 110 leadership positions, with key staff including Chief of Staff Leanne Christman (Chico Club) and Executive Secretary/Treasurer Carol Roberts (past District Governor).
- The district includes 66 clubs and 2,600 members, with 12 assistant governors serving as local resources and meeting monthly with club presidents.
- The district governor line requires a six-year commitment, including two and a half years of training, one year as governor, and three years of additional responsibility.

- The next district governor will be Woody Fridae (Winters Club), followed by Barry Casper (Pittsburgh Concord area), with the third successor to be selected in early fall.
- The district governor team meets every Monday morning via Zoom to discuss ongoing issues and policies, fostering continuity and cooperation.
- Mary Kipnitz, responsible for membership, recently completed zone training for membership chairs and returned with new ideas.
- Karen Lightfoot, highlighted for her work with Polio Plus, is a nurse educator at Chico State.
- The district president, Mario from Brazil, resigned two weeks before taking office due to unspecified personal problems.
- The board quickly appointed a retired dentist from Italy as the new president, described as modest and humble. The district conference theme, originally "Road to Rio" in honor of Mario's heritage, may be reconsidered.

ShelterBox, Disaster Relief, and Rotary Giving

- Members were encouraged to donate to ShelterBox if they had not already contributed to the club's gift basket.
- Joy will present the collected funds to the ShelterBox representative at the district conference in Santa Rosa, scheduled for May 1st through 3rd.
- Attendees were asked to mark their calendars for the conference.
- ShelterBox, originally a Rotary project, provides disaster relief supplies such as tents (\$500), shelter boxes (\$1,000), sleeping bags, pots, pans, and seeds.
- ShelterBox is currently active in Pakistan, distributing water filters due to contamination.
- Donations to ShelterBox can be made via check or through the district website (<u>rotarydistrict5160.org</u>).
- The ShelterBox CEO will be a major speaker at the upcoming district conference.
- Disaster relief projects in Ukraine and Palestine are on hold due to ongoing conflicts and lack of peace for rebuilding.

Grants, Environmental Stewardship, and Training

Literacy Grant:

- The club received approval for a literacy grant totaling \$17,000.
- The check from Rotary International is pending and will be presented in person due to its significance.
- Early literacy was praised as a valuable focus, with district funds amplifying the club's initial investment.

Environmental Stewardship:

- The club's river restoration project was commended for transforming an inaccessible, eroding river into a visible and approachable area.
- Efforts include reintroducing salmon and ongoing work led by **Randy Smith**, with regular updates shared with members.

Fall Festival of Learning:

- A virtual event focused on foundation and membership training, required for clubs.
- Scheduled for two hours: one hour on foundation, one hour on membership. Grant Training:
- To qualify for grants, at least one club member must attend training on the last day of January.
- The session will focus solely on grants, with stewardship training required only for grant recipients.

District Conference:

- Planning is underway for a conference at a new hotel with a locked-in room rate of \$159 (regular rate \$300).
- Activities include a carnival-themed Friday night party and a bike ride.
- The next district conference will be in Redding.
- Rotary International Conference:
 - This year's conference is in Taipei, Taiwan, with 33,000 registered attendees.
 - Future locations may include Dubai and the United States.

Personal Stories and Rotary Values


- A speaker shared a formative childhood experience with severe illness, which instilled a lifelong desire to help others.
- This led to a career as a psychologist and later involvement with Rotary, fulfilling a need for service.
- Rotary's mission to eradicate polio was highlighted, with emphasis on the impact of polio and the importance of supporting affected families.
- The current Rotary International theme, "Unite for Good," was discussed, urging members to practice ethical standards and peacemaking skills in a divided world.
- Joy shared her experience of contracting polio at age five during a Kansas City epidemic, describing the severity of her illness and her recovery.

- **Phil McCarthy** received the limited edition "Bridge Builder" pin, one of only 100, for his contributions to the club, presented by **DG Joy** and **President Wendy!**
- A basket of local items was presented as a token of appreciation.


