Bruce Dean introduced our Guest Speaker, John Hutchings, CEO & President of Fall River Brewing Co.

The program was referred to as

Beer Force One

John recently flew his plane up to the Pacific Northwest in an effort to build out his distribution partnerships!

It was efficient and successful!



John started homebrewing as a stress reliever in November 2011. In 2012, he operated a legitimate, licensed brewery out of his garage in Fall River Mills. After realizing it was a "time suck and money waste" as a hobby, he wrote a business plan for a year and, with his wife Amanda's support, decided to go "all-in" in 2013, securing an SBA loan and partners to build a new brewery, which is why the company is "established 2013." He left the construction industry in 2014 to focus full-time on the brewery.

The business grew to 5,000 barrels a year by 2018, but faced a "massive environmental concern" due to wastewater. In 2018, they moved to Redding, California, building a state-of-the-art facility on Eastside Road, which is now considered their "forever home." This facility features a Miramash filter from Belgium, a brewing technology previously reserved for macro brewers, making Fall River Brewing one of nine craft breweries in the US to have this investment. This system increases productivity by three, uses 25% less grain and 30% less water, effectively making every fourth batch free, and increased daily production capacity by 100% without adding labor. The brewery is projected to produce 19,000-20,000 barrels this year, ranking it as the 20th largest by production volume and 16th largest brand of all-year brands.

Fall River Brewing distributes across Northern California (from Bakersfield to the Oregon border), Oregon, Idaho, and Montana. John acquired his pilot's license four years ago during COVID, and they jokingly call their plane "Beer Force One," using it to cover vast territories efficiently. Expansion into Washington is planned for Q2 2026.

Two new tasting rooms are under construction: one at Redding Public Market (with the bar already turned up) and another at Cascade Village in Shasta Lake, both expected to be completed by the end of the year, though currently behind schedule. The company is also considering a future distillery, a personal interest of John's.

John noted that the overall beer industry is experiencing its first decline in 20 years, facing fierce competition and significant consolidation (two distributors control 80-90% of the California market). He highlighted a concern about Gen Z and Gen Y not consuming as much alcohol, leading to a shrinking "bottom end" of consumers. Despite these challenges, Fall River Brewing is the number one best-selling craft four-pack in California. He also spoke of a "big beer brewing brotherhood" where brewers support each other.




