Today's Program - Shasta Sheriff's Department K9

Judy Maxwell introduced our program for today, Shasta County Sheriff Michael Johnson, Detective Kylie Holroyd, and the star of the show, K-9 Toni. Sheriff Johnson kicked things off with some laughs and a bit of canine wisdom—dogs can change the tone of a scene instantly. He's been a Rotarian for 30 years and used to be a K-9 handler himself, so he knows the power of a good pup. His take: if staffing and budgets allowed, every rural deputy would have a dog. Even a friendly lab that can bark on command can shift attitudes on the street or brighten a tough day at the office.

Detective Holroyd brought the inside scoop—and **Toni** brought the charm. The county's K-9 program runs on community support through Friends of Shasta County K-9, a local nonprofit that funds the dogs,

training, and gear. It's not cheap to start a dog—think \$15,000—\$20,000 each—so the nonprofit covers those costs and donates trained, certified dogs to the county. Right now, there are six working dogs: five dual-purpose patrol/narcotics dogs and **Toni**, who's uniquely trained, plus several retirees living their best couch lives with their handlers. The nonprofit even helps with medical bills for those retirees.

So what makes **Toni** special? She's an Electronic Storage Device (ESD) and gunpowder detection dog. Translation: she can sniff out phones, USBs, micro SD cards, hard drives, shell casings, and hidden firearms. **Toni's** nose is tuned to a specific chemical found in memory-storing electronics, which means she's hunting for the stuff that actually holds data—like a USB tucked in a fake coin or a hidden camera disguised as a charging block. When detectives are digging through clutter and decoys, **Tony** is the fast "flashlight" that points them to what matters.

Toni helps in three big ways:

- Community outreach: She's a friendly, pettable police dog who makes law enforcement approachable at schools and events.
- Peer support: A wagging tail can be the best morale boost. **Toni** regularly visits departments to take the edge off tough days.
- Criminal investigations: From homicides and sexual assaults to property crimes and compliance checks, Toni
 finds what humans miss—especially hidden electronics and shell casings. She doesn't create probable cause,
 but she saves massive time.

Her journey started in January 2022 when her handler tested for K-9 and got **Toni** at just five months old—the youngest they've ever had, with no formal training. First came bonding, then a six-week handler school to learn **Toni's** "language" (her sit alert, tail flags, and head snaps). By April 2022, she passed certification and has re-certified each summer since.

Since then? Around 75 deployments with impressive wins: a hidden gun pulled from thick bushes in minutes after humans searched for half an hour; shell casings found in grassy lots; and a sneaky under-bed compartment packed with guns that she wouldn't stop alerting on until the team found it. She nailed a firearm wedged in a couch at a marijuana grow—missed by humans, sniffed by **Toni**.



Toni also supports compliance ops like "Operation Boo" on Halloween and arson task force sweeps. She's even certified for short-haul helicopter ops—vest, "doggles," the whole thing—so she can fly into remote scenes and make sure nothing gets missed.

She's social, calm, and great with "tiny humans." The nonprofit keeps the program strong with merch, fundraisers, and county-wide presentations. Costs run about \$30K annually through the county for vehicles, training, and maintenance, while the nonprofit covers dogs, food, and toys.

Bottom line: **Toni's** got a powerful nose and a big heart—proof that small dogs can do big work, build trust, and make a real difference.




